▶ **WORKSHOP A**

Exploring Gender Diversity and Equity Within PE Practice a.m. only

This workshop will explore many issues and help inform your practice in the way you understand and address gender stereotypes, gender inequality, and gender equity within your PE offer.

It will provide insight into gender diversity, looking at the lived experiences of gender diverse/questioning students and how "traditional" PE practices can be harmful to these students. It will include myth busting information about inclusion of gender diverse children and safety concerns, providing a tool kit to help teachers.

▶ **WORKSHOP B**

Baseball a.m. only

This Introduction to Baseball workshop will show delegates how to set up a field, positions, fielding and catching, fundamentals of hitting and basic rules of the game. It will look at the main activities in the Major League Baseball first pitch resource. We are so fortunate to have the head coach from Manchester baseball club / GB blind baseball who has over 26 years' experience coaching youth/adult sighted baseball and 5 years coaching blind baseball.

The workshop will provide any answers you are looking for and explore running a tournament.

▶ **WORKSHOP C**

Lacrosse a.m. and p.m.

The Lacrosse workshop is designed to give teachers the ability to coach 'POP' Lacrosse the non-contact schools version of the full game.

We will focus on the 4 fundamentals, catching, throwing, scooping, carrying and will incorporate a number of games to enhance development in a fun environment. Along with a series of hand eye coordination skills to help accelerate learning.

The workshop will provide the tools to enable teachers to plan and run a 6 week half term programme, taking a class from novices to playing 'small sided' games.

▶ **WORKSHOP D**

Inclusive PE Practical Workshop a.m. only

This is a practical course designed to introduce and build your confidence to inclusive PE delivery. The course is tailored towards teachers and teaching assistants working in primary and SEN schools. The course will introduce you to the Ten Principles, STEP tool and AIM using practical examples to bring these tools to life. You will then have time to plan and deliver a session based upon a given scenario, where you will be able to put STEP and AIM into practice.

To end the session, there will be time to think and reflect on the activity you delivered and create an action plan from the workshop.

▶ WORKSHOP E

Planning for the inclusion of children with SEND p.m. only

This theory workshop will look at specific types of SEND and how we can practically support these needs. It will help delegates identify potential barriers children have in a typical PE lesson, based on specific need, and consider what adjustments could be made to support them.

▶ WORKSHOP F

Volleyball p.m. only

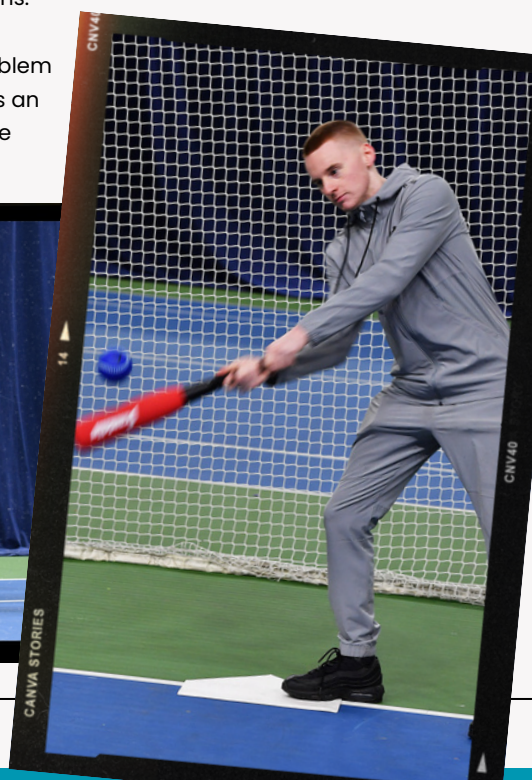
The Volleyball workshop is designed to equip teachers and coaches with the knowledge and understanding to facilitate fun and engaging sessions in school settings and prepare the children to play Volley2s. This small-sided version of volleyball simplifies the game, increases engagement and activity, is easy to learn and play different positions. Delegates will see how the game helps develop fundamental movement skills and promotes problem solving skills and basic game tactics. Volleyball is an ideal sport to develop positive behaviour in a safe non-contact environment.



▶ WORKSHOP G

Pickleball p.m. only

This workshop gives pickleball leaders the basic skills and knowledge to introduce the game to new players whilst learning in a safe and enjoyable environment. We will cover creating the right impression, getting people playing to learn, basic rules, basic strokes, organising learners and other useful information. You will observe practical demonstrations, (watch and learn) how to serve for example, then mirror what you have been shown, building up to leading mini pockets of activity.
